Description:	Cough for the past 3 or 4 days, not improving with antibiotics, removed FB [REDACTED]		

Findings:
There are three radiographs of the thorax available for interpretation. Focal consolidation with increased opacity and airbronchograms is noted in the cranial sub-segment of the left cranial lung lobe, as visualized on the ventral dorsal and right lateral radiographs. There is no evidence of megaesophagus. The remainder the study is unremarkable.

Assessment:
Differentials for the changes described include
-- aspiration pneumonia, bronchopneumonia etc.,
-- (less likely) focal pulmonary contusions/intra-pulmonary hemorrhage.

Recheck radiographs are recommended in 5 to 7 days to reevaluate and to monitor the response to treatment, or sooner if clinically indicated.
